For the last few years he has served as Purdue's Senior Associated Dean for Academic Affairs. He received his BA in Psychology at Harvard and his Ph.D. from the Institute of Child Development, at the University of Minnesota. His research focuses on social development in children and adolescents, most particularly friendships, processes of peer influence, and moral reasoning about social relationships.
